When Edna Ruth Byler first brought Puerto Rican needlework to North America in 1946, the term Fair Trade did not exist. Her volunteer project to provide market access for artisans spearheaded the Fair Trade movement in North America and eventually evolved into what has become Ten Thousand Villages.

This fall Ten Thousand Villages stores and Festival Sales across Canada and here in Hamilton will celebrate with displays, videos, and a door prize. "Ten Thousand Villages has been a presence in Hamilton for 11 years, thanks to many volunteers from Hamilton Mennonite Church who assist with the hosting of our annual Festival Sale," says Judy Geiger, lead coordinator of event. "It is very exciting to be showcasing and celebrating Ten Thousand Villages' amazing history."
